| $\Rightarrow$ |  | $\frac{-2 x}{-2}$ | $=\frac{0}{-2}$ |$\quad$ [transposing $5 x$ to LHS and 2 to RHS]

Hence, $x=0$ is an integer.
For option (b)
Given lingar equation is $\quad 4 x-18=2$
$\Rightarrow$
$4 x=2+18$
$\Rightarrow \quad 4 x=20$
$\Rightarrow \quad \frac{4 x}{4}=\frac{20}{4} \quad$ [dividing both sides by 4]
$\therefore \quad x=5$
Hence, $x=5$ is a positive integer.
For option (c)
Given linear equation is $4 x+7=x+2$
$\Rightarrow$
$4 x-x=2-7$
$\Rightarrow$
$3 x=-5$
$\therefore \quad x=\frac{-5}{3}$
[transposing $x$ to LHS and 7 to RHS]

Hence, $x=\frac{-5}{3}$ is neither a fraction nor an integer.

Solution. (a) The shifting of a number from one side of an equation to other side is called transposition.
e.g. $x+a=0$ is the equation, $x=-a$

Here, number 'a' shifts from left hand side to right hand side

| $\Rightarrow$ | $\frac{25 x-6 x}{15}=4$ | [taking LCM in LHS] |
| $\Rightarrow$ | $19 x=60$ |  |
| $\Rightarrow$ | $\frac{19 x}{19}=\frac{60}{19}$ | [dividing both sides by 19] |
| $\therefore$ | $x=\frac{60}{19}$ |  |
| Now, | $2 x-7=2 \times \frac{60}{19}-7$ | [putting the value of $x$ ] |
|  | $=\underline{120-133}=-\frac{13}{13}$ | [taking LCM] |
|  | 19 - $=-\frac{1}{19}$ | [taking LCM] |
| Hence, the numerical value of $2 x-7$ is $-\frac{13}{19}$. |  |  |

Solution. (a) If $\mathrm{ax}=\mathrm{b}$, then $\mathrm{x}=\frac{b}{a}$
Since, a and b are positive integers. So,$\frac{b}{a}$ is also positive integer, Hence, the solution of the given equation has to be always positive.

$$

\Rightarrow \quad x=17-1 \quad \text { [transposing } 1 \text { to RHS] }
$$

$\therefore \quad x=16$
Hence, the smallest multiple of 7 is $7 \times 16$, i.e. 112 .

If the remaining money in Aarushi's pocket is Rs 1600, then find the sum gifted by Anushka.

## Solution.

Let Anushka and Aarushi have equal amount of money in their packet, which is $₹ x$.
After giving $\frac{1}{3}$ of the money of Anushka to Aarushi,
Amount of Aarushi $=₹\left(x+\frac{x}{3}\right)$
According to the question,

| $\therefore$ | $x$ | $=24$ |

Hence, the number of flowers offered by Kaustubh in the temple is 24.

Question. 84 The sum of three consecutive even natural numbers is 48 . Find the greatest of these numbers.

Solution.

$\Rightarrow \quad$ Weight of Box $C=x-\frac{5}{2}+\frac{41}{4} \mathrm{~kg}=x+\left(\frac{-10+41}{4}\right) \mathrm{kg}=\left(x+\frac{31}{4}\right) \mathrm{kg}$
As, total weight of three boxes $=48 \frac{3}{4} \mathrm{~kg}=\frac{195}{4} \mathrm{~kg}$

$\because$ Total weight of three boxes $=$ Weight of box $A+$ Weight of box $B+$ Weight of box $C$
$\therefore \quad \frac{195}{4}=x+x-\frac{5}{2}+x+\frac{31}{4}$

Giver, salary received by man for the month of February is $₹ 9100$.

Solution.
Let speed of the steamer in still water be $x \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$.
Speed of the stream $=3 \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$
[given]
Now, speed of the steamer downstream $=(x+3) \mathrm{km} / \mathrm{h}$
and speed of the steamer upstream $=(x-3) \mathrm{km} / \mathrm{h}$
According to the question,
Distance covered in 3 hby steamer downstream

$$
\text { = Distance covered in } 5 \mathrm{~h} \text { by steamer upstream }
$$

$$
\begin{array}{lrr}
\therefore & 3(x+3)=5(x-3) \quad[\because \text { distance }=\text { speed } \times \text { time }] \\
\Rightarrow & 3 x+9=5 x-15 \\
\Rightarrow & 3 x-5 x=-15-9 \\
\Rightarrow & -2 x=-24 \\

Find the number of chocolates purchased.

Similarly, she purchased $x$ candies.

Then, speed of steamer downstream $=(x+1) \mathrm{km} / \mathrm{h}$
and speed of steamer upstream $=(x-1) \mathrm{km} / \mathrm{h}$
According to the question,
Distance covered upstream = Distance covered downstream
$\Rightarrow$ (Speed of steamer in upstream) $\times$ Time taken upstream

$$
\begin{array}{r}
=(\text { Speed of steamer downstream }) \times \text { Time taken downstream } \\
{[\because \text { distance }=\text { speed } \times \text { time }]}
\end{array}
$$

$$
\Rightarrow \quad(x-1) \times 6=(x+1) \times 5
$$

$$
\Rightarrow \quad 6 x-6=5 x+5
$$

$$
\Rightarrow \quad 6 x-5 x=6+5
$$

$$
\therefore \quad x=11
$$

Therefore, the speed of steamer in still water is $11 \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$.

Question. 108 Distance between two places A and B is 210 km . Two cars start simultaneously from $A$ and $B$ in opposite directions and distance between them after 3 hours is 54 km . If speed of one car is less than that of other by $8 \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$, then find the speed of each.

## Solution.

Let the speed of car starts from Abe $x \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$.
Then, speed of car starts from $B=(x+8) \mathrm{km} / \mathrm{h}$
Given, distance between the cars after $3 \mathrm{~h}=54 \mathrm{~km}$


According to the question,
Total distance between $A$ and $B$ - Total distance covered by both cars in $3 \mathrm{~h}=54$
$\Rightarrow$
$[\because$ distance $=$ speed $\times$ time $]$
$\Rightarrow \quad 210-3 x-3 x-24=54$
$\Rightarrow \quad-6 x=-210+24+54$
$\Rightarrow \quad-6 x=-210+78$
$\Rightarrow \quad-6 x=-132$
$\Rightarrow \quad x=-132 \times\left(\frac{-1}{6}\right)$
$\therefore \quad x=22$
Hence, the speed of car starts from $A=22 \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$
and the speed of car starts from $B=22+8=30 \mathrm{~km} / \mathrm{h}$

Question. 109 A carpenter charged Rs 2500 for making a bed. The cost of materials used is Rs 1100 and the labour charge is Rs 200 per hour. For how many hours did the carpenter work?

Solution.
Let the carpenter worked for $x \mathrm{~h}$.
Given, labour charge $=₹ 200$ per hour
Then, total labour charge $=₹ 200 x$
As, amount charged by carpenter for making a bed
$=$ Cost of materials + Total labour charge
$\therefore \quad .2500=1100+200 x \Rightarrow 200 x=2500-1100$
$\Rightarrow \quad 200 x=1400 \Rightarrow x=\frac{1400}{200}=7$
Hence, the carpenter worked for 7 h .

Question. 110 For what value of x is the perimeter of shape 77 cm ?


Solution.

Given, perimeter of shape $=77 \mathrm{~cm}$
$\therefore$ Sum of all sides of the shape $=77$
$\Rightarrow(x+1)+(x+1)+(x+2)+(2 x+1)+(2 x+2)=77$
$\begin{array}{lrl}\Rightarrow & 7 x+7=77 & \Rightarrow 7 x=77-7 \\ \Rightarrow & 7 x & =70\end{array}$
Hence, the value of $x$ is 10 cm .

Question. 111 For what value of x is the perimeter of shape 186 cm ?


Solution.
Given, length of the given figure $=(5 x+6)$
and breadth of the given figure $=(2 x+66)$
$\because$ Perimeter of shape $=186 \mathrm{~cm}$
[given]
$\therefore \quad 2 \times($ Length + Breadth $)=186$
$\Rightarrow \quad 2 \times[(5 x+6)+(2 x+66)]=186$
$\Rightarrow \quad 2 \times[7 x+72]=186$
$\Rightarrow \quad 14 x+144=186$
$\Rightarrow \quad 14 x=186-144$
$\Rightarrow \quad 14 x=42$
$\Rightarrow \quad x=\frac{42}{14}$
$\therefore \quad x=3$
Hence, the value of $x$ is 3 cm .

Question. 112 On dividing Rs 200 between $A$ and $B$, such that twice of A's share is less than 3 times B's share by 200, what is B's share?

Solution.
Let $B^{\prime} \mathrm{s}$ share be $₹ \boldsymbol{x}$. Then, $A^{\prime} \mathrm{s}$ share $=₹(200-x)$
According to the question,

$$
\begin{array}{rlrl} 
& 2 \times\left(A^{\prime} \text { 's share }\right)=3 \times(\text { B's share })-200 \\
\Rightarrow & 2 \times(200-x) & =3 x-200 \\
\Rightarrow & 400-2 x & =3 x-200 \\
\Rightarrow & -2 x-3 x & =-200-400 \\
\Rightarrow & -5 x & =-600 \\
\Rightarrow & x & =-600 \times\left(-\frac{1}{5}\right) \\
& \therefore & x & =120
\end{array}
$$

Question. 113 Madhulika thought of a number, doubled it and added 20 to it. On dividing the resulting number by 25 , she gets 4 . What is the number?
Solution.
Let the number be $x$.
According to the question,
$\left.\begin{array}{lrl} & \frac{2 x+20}{25} & =4 \\ \Rightarrow & 2 x+20 & =25 \times 4 \\ \Rightarrow & 2 x+20 & =100 \\ \Rightarrow & 2 x & =100-20 \\ \Rightarrow & 2 x & =80 \\ \Rightarrow & x & =\frac{80}{2} \\ & \therefore & x\end{array}\right)$
