The Royal Bengal is the most protected animal in India and its population is booming, but missing tigers are the weakest link in the conservation success story. There's hardly any mechanism to monitor tigers that have strayed out of their designated habitat.

Among the missing tigers in recent times was Ookhan of Tadoba-Andhari in Maharashtra. He was found this March at a place about 100 km away from where he was spotted last almost four years ago. The photograph taken in 2013 helped track the seven-year-old male. Stripe patterns are unique to every tiger and that is their identity marker. Ookhan is a lucky break on a long list of tigers that went missing and never found. The Maharashtra forest department has yet to trace Jai, the iconic tiger of Nagpur's Umred Karhandla wildlife sanctuary, who went missing on April 18, 2016. A year later, and after searches across Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, forest officials have no clue if the animal with a radio collar around its neck is alive or dead.

Ookhan or Jai are not stray cases. It is quite common in the wild for dominant tigers occupying the rich prey base to push out the weaker ones to the hinterland. A tiger's territory ranges from 10 to 12 square km, and the number of tigers moving out to different zones for food and water has increased recently with their population rising on the back of conservation efforts. Tracking them becomes important both for research and understanding the animal outside their protected core areas.



	Elliot Erwitt, a documentary photographer with an amazing gift for noticing things said, "To me, photography is an art of observation finding something interesting in an ordinary place it has little to do with the things you see and everything to do with the way you see them." Contemplative photography helps us to possess the ability to see the world the way children do; they marvel at ordinary things that the rest of us often overlook.	
	A teacher of contemplative photography suggests that when you go out to photograph, ask yourself where you sense the energy focused at that particular moment, and to then compose your photograph around that area, yet remembering it will not be the same the next day. There is a transitory aspect that makes the moment precious. Your role as a contemplative photographer is to make connection and meaning from what you perceive, at that particular moment. Often what we 'see' is clouded by our interpretation of what we see. Practising contemplative photography teaches us to become more mindful of how much we add to everyday noticing. Approaching nature and life with your unlikely mindfulness teacher, the camera being open yet not trying too hard you find that the photographs you make will resonate with personal meaning and life lessons for you.
